Criterion #4: Easy access

Sub-criterion: Exclude any provinces with no less than 7 regular flights / vessels a week from Honiara

Criterion #1: Local People replying on forest resources

Sub-criterion: Exclude urban communities located within 5 km from Honiara / Provincial Capital Cities

Criterion #4: Easy access
